CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

PIER CONSTRUCTION BEGINS

In Greenwich Village Segment of the Park



We are in the process of removing the old piers and constructing new piers.

Pile driving operations are underway. Pile driving is just what it sounds like – long concrete columns reinforced with interior steel cables are driven into the ground – in this case the Hudson River bed. These columns, or piles, will

serve as the foundation for the new piers. After the columns are in place work can begin on laying the pier surface. The piers will be topped with a light brown colored granite that you may have already seen along some of the walkways in this area. When these piers are complete in the fall of 2002, you will be able to stroll out

into the Hudson River, lounge on the pier and catch a glimpse of the many historic vessels that call the piers along the Hudson River home.

At Pier 57, we are painting the building that houses municipal buses. The freshly painted building will be a green color similar to the Statue of Liberty. Pier 57 has an interesting

history. Constructed upstate in 1954, and decorated in an art deco style, it was floated down the Hudson to its present location and then sunk! It now rests on concrete caissons that remain watertight to this day. The new coat of paint should help Pier 57 adapt to its new parkland surroundings.
